

Darren Griffin is Professor of Genetics at the University of Kent. He is director of the Centre for Interdisciplinary Studies of Reproduction (www.kent.ac.uk/cisor) which has a remit to encourage cross-disciplinary endeavour. As president of the International Chromosome and Genome Society he promotes the interests of chromosome research and science communication worldwide. His personal research interests include the study of chromosome analysis, the genetics of early human development (including preimplantation genetic diagnosis) gametogenesis and chromosome evolution (including an interest in dinosaur chromosomes). He has published over 200 scholarly manuscripts and raised over £10 million in grant funding. He is a regular contributor to the national and local media, speaking on issues such as 'designer babies' and personalized genomics.
